But wait, there's more! Since the deck is smaller, the ranking of hands changes slightly. In 6+ Hold'em, a flush beats a full house! That's right, if two players have a flush, the winner is determined by the highest card in the flush.

Now, let's talk benefits! 6+ Hold'em offers several advantages over traditional Texas Hold'em:

1. More powerful and exciting hands: With a smaller deck, players have a higher chance of creating stronger hands, making for a more thrilling game.
